FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC FOR REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

This combined notice is intended to satisfy two separate procedural requirements: 1) 24 CFR 58.43, Dissemination and/or publication of the Findings of No Significant Impact and 2) 24 CFR 58.70, Notice of Intent to Request Release of Funds. The public is advised to specify which notice their comments address, so that the City of Buena Park may properly take into account the comments received.

On or about October 23, 2020, the City of Buena Park will request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383). Community Development Block Grant funds will be used for the following activity:

- Single Family Rehabilitation Loans and Grants – Loans and grants are for single family housing units to address code violations and/or deferred maintenance. Program income may be used to fund single family and rehabilitation activities. Loans will be available city-wide (approximately \$250,000 per year).

The City of Buena Park has determined that these actions will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment, and accordingly the City of Buena Park has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).

The reasons for such decision not to prepare such a Statement are as follows: Proposed activities will not be located near wetlands, wild/scenic rivers, farmlands, sole source water aquifers, coastal areas or endangered species habitats. Each activity will be individually reviewed to ensure compliance with applicable regulations including flood plain management, historic preservation, explosive and flammable operations hazards, airport clear zone issues, toxic chemicals and radioactive material hazards, and lead based paint hazards. Furthermore, compliance with all City ordinances and permit conditions will minimize impacts on the environment in terms of noise and air quality (i.e., construction dust).

An Environmental Review Record respecting the subject project(s) has been made by the City of Buena Park which documents the environmental review of this project and more fully sets the reasons why such statement is not required. The Environmental Review Record is on file and is available for public examination and copy upon request at the Economic Development Division, Buena Park City Hall, 6650 Beach Blvd., Buena Park, CA 90621-2905, between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Due to the fact that the scope of these activities will not substantially change from year to year, this Environmental Review Record will cover five program years from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2025.

No further federal environmental review of such project(s) is proposed to be conducted prior to the request of release of Federal funds.

With respect to Flood Plain Management, the City of Buena Park has utilized the Eight-Step Decision making process per Executive Order 11988 and 24 CFR 55.20. These steps include the following:

1. The city has determined that it is possible some housing rehabilitation activities may be located in a 100 year flood plain.
2. This notice is being published to notify the public that such activities may be undertaken.
3. The city has evaluated alternatives to undertaking these activities including: a) not undertaking activities; b) move forward with activities.
4. Potential impacts of alternatives have been considered. Not undertaking activities could lead to the deterioration of a portion of the city's housing stock into a state of disrepair and/or unsafe conditions. Undertaking activity could result in flooding of assisted housing units.
5. The city will require participants with homes in 100 year flood plains to obtain flood insurance, thereby public's assistance can better protected in case of a flood.
6. The city has reevaluated its requirement of flood insurance and has determined that it is practical since it is not practical to deny assistance to property owners in need of assistance to repair homes to health and safety standards.
7. Since no practical alternative is available, this publication serves as notice that the city will move forward with proposed activities.
8. The city will move forward requiring all program participants owning residences in a 100 year flood plain to obtain and maintain flood insurance.

The City of Buena Park is certifying to HUD that Aaron France, in his official capacity as Certifying Officer, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to project(s) environmental review, decision making and action, and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of this certification is that upon its approval, the City of Buena Park and HUD will have satisfied their responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and the project may proceed. HUD will accept an objection to its approval of this certification if it is on one of the following basis:

- (a) That the Certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer;
- (b) that the City of Buena Park has failed to make a finding of environmental significance or to make the written determination required for re-evaluation of an environmental assessment or use of prior Environmental Impact Statement, as applicable;
- (c) the City of Buena Park has omitted one or more of the required steps for the preparation, publication and completion of the Environmental Assessment;
- (d) the City of Buena Park has committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR 58 before release of funds and approval of the environmental certification by HUD (or the state);
- (e) other basis established by HUD regulations.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City of Buena Park to the Economic Development Division. Such written comments should be received at 6650 Beach Blvd., Buena Park, CA 90621-2905 on or before October 23, 2020. All such comments so received will be considered and the City of Buena Park will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

Objections may also be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR 58, Subpart H), and may be addressed to HUD at: Office of Community Planning and Development, 300 N. Los Angeles Street, Suite 4054, Los Angeles, CA 90012.

Objections to this undertaking on any basis other than those stated above will not be considered by HUD.

No objections received after October 23, 2020 will be considered by HUD.
