

COVID sends ingenious idea into a new orbit

Cypress College made news last year when it became the only institution of its kind in the USA to install a high tech 737 Max simulator, thanks to the generosity of an anonymous one-million-dollar donor.

Before COVID, the airlines were begging for pilots and with the simulator, enrollment ballooned at the college.

According to Capt. Ed Valdez, Chairman of the Travel and Aviation Department, the growing array of flight simulators was expected to produce “better pilots” as technicians and flight instructors can now simulate a wide range of situations.

Then disaster struck as a series of 737 crashes grounded the aircraft until this past week, when the Federal Aviation Administration finally re-certified the aircraft for commercial flight.

Valdez said this week that although Cypress College will get the procedural and software fixes to the 737 Max, COVID has long prevented students from returning to campus.

This has not stopped flight lessons, said Valdez, “but I really had to think on my feet.”

Using a series of aviation web sites, Google earth and unique programming, Valdez learned how to create a do-it-yourself simulator that allowed students to take lessons via Zoom and other online technologies.

“Students can learn cross country procedures, airport to airport techniques, flight planning, etc.,” said Valdez, saying he learned so much about the hardware and software, that he’s already installed his self-made flight simulators at Fullerton, Torrance and other locations, where students can learn to fly.

He said the screens, monitors, computers, and software are all encased in aluminum and truly, said Valdez, “I kind of like this better than classroom.”

Going forward, he said, students will be able to learn to fly on campus or online. Online students are obviously limited to one-at-a-time, he said.

Valdez is a longtime airline Captain for United Airlines. He is currently on leave from the

airline and will take an early retirement to focus on his new venture.

By necessity, the man who

helped build the first 737 Simulator thinks his self-made version will soar.

Virus or not, said Valdez, using

a bit of ingenuity will keep virtual airplanes in the air. With this new self-made version, he said “flight schools can continue to fly.”

Orange County Water District’s COVID-19 response assures water safety, transparency and education

During the COVID-19 pandemic, California’s Brown Act, which guarantees the public’s right to attend and participate in meetings of local legislative bodies, was suspended, access to the Orange County Water District (OCWD; the District) facility and H2O Learning Center were severely restricted in accordance to national and local guidelines, but the dissemination of important information and education needed to continue—especially in light of misinformation that was circulating about the safety and reliability of local drinking water.

OCWD manages the Orange County Groundwater Basin, which supplies 77% of the drinking water to 19 water agencies and cities and their 2.5 million customers in north and central Orange County.

The primary goal of OCWD’s response has been to assure the safety and reliability of the water supply and to highlight the measures taken to reduce the spread of COVID-19 among OCWD staff, local water suppliers and the public—all while continuing to provide

essential services and transparency.

As a response to misinformation regarding water safety, OCWD created a webpage containing the District’s response to COVID-19 along with a robust list of resources. The site was shared with staff, media, OCWD’s local water suppliers, and the community and is still updated on a regular basis.

The District continues to publish its monthly e-newsletter with articles about its response, existing programs and updates that affect the greater community. In addition, it created a virtual outreach campaign that includes the following:

- TOURS: OCWD created a 1.5 hour monthly virtual tour of the Groundwater Replenishment System, the largest potable reuse facility in the world. Pre-COVID, OCWD’s in-person tour program attracted more than 4,000 global guests annually, including

hundreds of local students. Virtual tours can be tailored to special groups and classes as well. The District also created a 20 minute on-demand virtual tour, which was

viewed more than 2,000 times during the first few months. To learn more about the tour program and to register, please visit www.ocwd.com/gwrs.

- MEETINGS: OCWD’s new

virtual speaker’s bureau offers the opportunity for staff to participate in panel discussions or presentations to groups and organizations; the monthly board and committee meetings are accessible via Zoom, which meets the public’s right to transparency; and all employee meetings continue in a virtual format.

- WATER WEBINARS: OCWD created a virtual monthly webinar series that focuses on water projects and issues such as water reuse, seawater contamination, per- and polyfluoroalkyl chemical studies, and debunking tap vs. bottled water myths. An OCWD staff member and District partners host each webinar which is free and attracts as many as 200 participants per month.

- WATER ADVISORY COMMITTEE OF ORANGE COUNTY (WACO) PRESENTATIONS: Monthly WACO meetings, now held virtually, debate current and emerging water issues among

Orange County policymakers and global water professionals.

- STUDENT EDUCATION PROGRAMS: Virtual outdoor education programs at the Prado Wetlands and a virtual Next Generation Water Leaders Program that guides students through operations of the groundwater basin and showcases careers in the water sector were created.

OCWD is proud of its successful efforts to quickly and effectively adapt to the challenges facing us during the COVID-19 pandemic. THE COURT ORDERS that all persons interested in this matter shall appear before this court at the hearing indicated below to show cause, if any, why the petition for change of name should not be granted.
