The ordinance will amend the Westminster Municipal Code by adding Section 2.04.130 a Policy Governing Public Official and Employee Interactions. The Mayor and City Council make policies and fundamental governmental decisions for the City. The City Manager is charged with implementing the policies and decisions of the City Council and with administering the day-to-day affairs of the City With the assistance of staff, which are under the City Manager's authority. The City Council has direct authority over the City Manager. There is a degree of partnership and collaboration between Public Officials and City staff.
